Short-Term Therapy Success

Richard W. is a 64-year-old who had a hospital stay following acute respiratory failure with hypoxia, muscle wasting and atrophy. Upon admission, he required maximum assistance for transfers and moderate-maximal assistance for activities of daily living including toileting and getting dressed. His goal was to return home and use a walker without assistance.



After 41 days of PT/OT rehab he was able to transfer using a rollator walker and perform activities of daily living with modified independence and bathe with set up assistance.

Richard was eager to work, meeting his goal of returning home. He will continue therapy with home health services to safely acclimate back into his home setting.
